

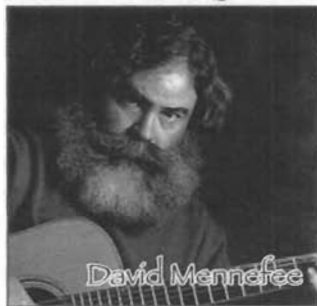

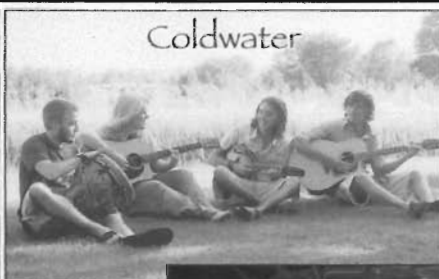

Levi Sikkema



Love brought Levi Sikkema to Ohio from his native Harbor Springs, MI in 2006. He married Erica Fischer, daughter of Dan and Nancy Fischer, bought a house, and received a promotion. At 28, he was living his dream. That dream became a nightmare in January 2008, when Levi sustained a massive brain-stem stroke so severe many did not expect him to survive. Survival would prove to be only the first step in Levi's arduous adventure.

Levi is cognitively unimpaired, but he cannot speak. He communicates using only his eyes. A quadriplegic, Levi is confined to a wheelchair, and because he cannot swallow consistently, he is fed through a tube in his stomach. Levi has defied the odds in his struggle not just to survive, but also to lead a full, productive life. There is amazing technology available to help Levi, but it is prohibitively expensive for this young couple and not covered by insurance.

Levi is an extraordinary young man who finds himself in even more extraordinary circumstances. While he is fighting to recover, he and his wife are faced with enormous expenses for equipment, home modifications, and health care.
